Important Covid-19 Update – Anglesey and Shobnall Outbreak

Staffordshire County Council is currently working with local communities to manage an increase in cases in Burton.

These are currently centred in Anglesey and Shobnall, with some areas of Horninglow also affected.

We want to prevent further spread of infection by making sure that people follow advice to keep themselves and their loved ones safe:

This includes:

- Washing your hands regularly.
- Stay home as much as possible. If you do go out keep 2m distance from other people.
- Wear a face covering on public transport and in shops.
- If you have any symptoms of a high temperature, a new, persistent cough or a loss of taste or smell, you must stay home and book a test.
- If contacted by NHS Test & Trace stay in for 14 days.

We are also offering people who live in **affected areas only** tests in their own homes if they don't have access to a car. Ring 0300 111 8050.
