

Build a Bonfire

Skills and knowledge to develop:

Collect a range of dried leaves and sticks and use them to make a bonfire. Invite a small group of children to sit around the bonfire.

Discuss what they can see and how the bonfire smells.

Invent, adapt and recount narratives and stories with peers and their teacher.

Diwali Dancing

Skills and knowledge to develop:

Listen to music from a wide variety of celebrations and talk about how the music makes them feel and their favourites. Play a variety of traditional Hindi music, which is played during Diwali, for the children to listen and dance to.

Wonderful Winter

Skills and knowledge to develop:

Understand some important processes and changes in the natural world around them, including the seasons and changing states of matter. Talk about things they can do on winter evenings and things they can do on summer evenings and begin to notice the difference in day length

Celebration Food

Skills and knowledge to develop:

Manage their own basic hygiene and personal needs, including dressing, going to the toilet and understanding the importance of healthy food choices.

Explore and try a range of foods and suggest where they come from
