

## History- Maafa

This project teaches children about Africa past and present and the development of the slave trade. It also explores Britain's role in the transatlantic slave trade and the causes and consequences of the European colonisation of Africa.

- To learn about a non-European society that provides contrasts with British history.
- To know and understand significant aspects of the history of the wider world, including the nature of ancient civilisations; the expansion and dissolution of empires; characteristic features of past non-European societies.
- To understand historical concepts such as continuity and change, cause and consequence, similarity, difference and significance.
- To understand methods of historical enquiry.

## Science-Electricity

- To associate the brightness of a lamp or the volume of a buzzer with the number and voltage of cells used in the circuit.
- To compare and give reasons for variations in how components function, including the brightness of bulbs, the loudness of buzzers and the on/off position of switches.
- To use recognised symbols when representing a simple circuit in a diagram.
